What is The Early Years Foundation Stage?

 The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.

 It is based on recognition that children learn best through play and active learning. The Early Years Curriculum is made up of 7 areas of Learning. All areas are connected to each other and they are equally important.

- 1. Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- 2. Communication and Language
- 3. Physical development
- 4. Literacy
- 5. Maths
- 6. Understanding the World
- 7. Expressive Arts and Design

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- The children will be learning to:
- become self-confident;
- take an interest in things;
- know what their own needs are;
- dress and undress independently;
- become independent;
- > tell the difference between right and wrong.



Communication and Language

The children will be learning to:

- talk confidently and clearly;
- enjoy listening to stories, songs and poems;
- hear and say sounds, and link them to the alphabet.

Physical Development

- The children will be learning to:
- move confidently;
- control their body;
- handle big equipment as bikes or balls;
- handle small equipment such as pens, scissors and paint brushes.

Literacy – writing and reading

- The children will be learning to:
- > make marks and talk about what marks mean;
- learn to use a pencil effectively;
- handle books carefully;
- talk about the pictures in a book;
- > talk about what might happen next in the story.

Maths

- The children will be learning to:
- > become comfortable with numbers,
- > number composition, subitising
- recognise some numbers, and talk about groups of "one more" and "one less"



- use mathematical vocabulary like "heavier than", "Bigger", "smaller than"
- be aware of shapes and space, naming shapes, and playing with shapes, seeing how they fit together.

Understanding the World

- The children will explore:
- > the world around them, asking questions about it.
- > building with different materials, know about everyday technology and learn what is it used for.
- past events in their lives and their families' lives.
- different cultures and beliefs.



Expressive Arts and Design

- The children will explore:
- > colours and shape
- making things
- role play
- making music.

The first few weeks

Baseline Assessments - We will find out what the children already know and can do and use this information to help us develop a Curriculum to suits the needs of our children

We spend lots of our time working and talking to the children about what they are learning. We may record some 'Wow' moments formally but largely we assess and move children on 'in the moment' and so not everything gets recorded.



You will be invited to discuss how your child has settled in and their progress so far at the parents Consultation Meetings.



Other Matters

Pupil Premium — the way Nursery education is funded has changed slightly over the past few years. If you fulfil a set criteria as laid out by the Government, additional monies are available to schools to support the learning and development of your child. **You must also get at least one of the following:**

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get

Other Matters

- Reception Class Although you have accepted a place in our Nursery, you do not automatically get a place in our Reception class.
- ➤ The Local Authority are responsible for allocating Reception places.
- When your child starts our Nursery, you will get a letter explaining the procedures for applying for a school place. Applications are made online.
